

# Alma Matilda Nustad Brekke

March 28, 1899 – March 30, 1988



Alma Brekke, age 89, formerly of Renner, South Dakota, passed away on March 30, 1988, in Sioux Falls.

Alma Nustad was born on March 28, 1899, near Renner, South Dakota, where she grew up. She married Halvor Brekke on May 12, 1918, in Sioux Falls. The couple farmed near Renner for several years before moving into town. Halvor preceded her in death on November 24, 1951.

Alma dedicated 17 years of service to the South Dakota School for the Deaf, beginning in 1954, where she worked as a dormitory houseparent. Through her steady presence and care, she played an important role in the daily lives of Deaf students, providing structure, support, and a sense of home during their school years.

In addition to her work at SDSD, Alma was a homemaker and also worked as a cook at Renner

Corner. She was a lifelong member of Renner Lutheran Church.

Alma was one of twelve siblings and was the proud mother of five children. She is survived by her children and their families, along with numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held on April 2, 1988, at Renner Lutheran Church, with burial at West Nidaros Cemetery near

Crooks, South Dakota.
